- 1 Which "bans" would you do away with?
- 2 I would revoke all bans except for three.
- 1 Name them.
- 2 All forms of violence should remain banned.
- 1 By whom?
- 2 By the state.
- 4 But many states are being violent themselves.
- 2 Then, these states should be banned.
- 4 By whom?
- 2 By other states.
- 3 If one state wants to ban another state that means war.
- 2 War is violence. Violence should be banned.
- 1 By whom?
- 3 I don't know.
- 1 Okay, what else should be banned?
- 2 Nationalism.
- 1 What's this?
- 2 Humiliation of a person based on their nationality.
- 1 Are Israelis and Palestinians equal?

1 - Are Serbs and Albanians equal?

Pause

1 - Are Azerbaijani and Armenians equal?

1 - Are Ukrainians and Russians equal?

- 1 Are animals and people equal?
- 2 It's uncertain.
- 3 To whom?
- 2 To animals.
- 3 Do people know this?
- 2 Some, but not all of them.
- 4 Why can we kill a cow but not a human?
- 1 Because a cow doesn't think.
- 3 And a person with brain damage? They don't think either. Can they be killed?
- 2 No.
- 3 Why?
- 1 -They are a human being.
- 4 So, you can't kill a human being, but a cow you can kill?
- 1 Yes.
- 4 Why?
- 1 Because a cow was created for this.
- 2 What was a cow created for?
- 1 For a man to eat it.
- 4 Is that the purpose a cow was created for?
- 1 Yes.
- 3 No.
- 1 Yes.
- 3 And a pig?
- 1 A pig was created for this too.
- 4 And fish?
- 1 Yes.
- 3 No.
- 2 Are you anti-abortion?
- 1 Yes.
- 3 No.
- 2 Why?
- 3 A woman should have the right to choose.
- 4 In case of rape?
- 1 Yes.
- 4 Or when it is a threat to her life?
- 1 Yes.
- 2 And what if she just no longer wants it?
- 1 No longer wants a baby?
- 2 Yes, what if she just changed her mind?
- 3 Or got pregnant by accident.
- 4 It's her choice.
- 1 A woman's choice?
- 3 Yes.
- 2 Is abortion the murder of an unborn human?
- 4 No.

- 3 It's not murder.
- 1 -Is the artificial termination of life not a murder?
- 3 No.
- 1 Murder is an artificial, violent termination of life.
- 2 Taking the life of another living being without its consent is murder.
- 4 An embryo is not a person yet.
- 3 Abortion is not murder because the embryo does not yet have human characteristics.
- 4 An embryo is not a person yet.
- 1 So when does a person become a "person"?
- 2 When they start to think.
- 4 So it's all about thinking?
- 2 It's all about a set of multiple factors.
- 1 How do you define "a person"?
- 2 It is a set of many factors.
- 3 Name them.
- 2 Thoughts. Body. Nerves. Energy. Genes. Nurturing environment.
- 4 Subtle astral body.
- 3 Subtle astral body is unscientific.
- 4 And also bacteria, the millions of micro-organisms that inhabit a person.
- 2 And karma.
- 3 Karma is unscientific.
- 4 Karma means action. Action is scientific.
- 1 What else?
- 2 A person can compare and evaluate. Able to know oneself.
- 1 And a baby?
- 3 It knows itself.
- 2- It knows itself?
- 3 It knows itself as best as it can. At the level of its body and instincts.
- 4 Just like an animal?
- 3 An animal doesn't know itself.
- 1 Then, it can be killed?
- 4 A baby doesn't know itself.
- 3 So we can kill it?
- 2 No.
- 4 And an embryo?
- 3 It doesn't know itself.
- 2 It does.
- 3 No.
- 4 From what day of life can a person be killed, and from what day can they not be?
- 3 An embryo is not a person.
- 4 From what month of life does an embryo become a person?
- 1 At 22 weeks.
- 2 From the very beginning.
- 3 From the beginning of what?
- 2 From the beginning of everything.

- 1 Very well. What's the third banned thing?
- 2 Drugs should be banned.
- 1 All of them?
- 2 Yes.
- 4 What are drugs?
- 2 There is a clear definition.
- 4 Define it.
- 2 Substances that are addictive and require ever-increasing doses.
- 1 Caffeine?
- 4 Doesn't require a dose increase.
- 3 It does.
- 4 No, it doesn't.
- 2 Caffeine causes addiction.
- 4 Yes.
- 1 Then do we need to ban coffee?
- 2 Yes.
- 4 No.
- 3 Let the doctors decide. If caffeine is a drug, then it should be banned.
- 1 Marijuana?
- 2 Doesn't cause addiction.
- 4 It does.
- 2 No, it doesn't.
- 4 It does.
- 2 Not a physical one.
- 4 It causes a mental addiction that grows into a physical one.
- 3 Let the doctors decide.
- 2 In some countries, the doctors decided it was OK.
- 3 It is not the doctors who decided.
- 1 Who decided then?
- 3 It's business.
- 4 It's politics.
- 1 Money from the sale of cannabis?
- 3 Money from selling cannabis and controlling the drugs business.
- 1 And why are psychedelic mushrooms banned?
- 4 These are drugs.
- 1 Mushrooms do not cause addiction and do not require a dose increase.
- 3 Then, they are not drugs.
- 4 But they are banned.
- 1 Why?
- 2 There is a third factor.
- 4 What factor?
- 2 Altered state of consciousness.
- 3 What is Consciousness?
- 2 Consciousness is how a person perceives themselves and the real world around them.
- 4 Consciousness is reality.

- 3 Mushrooms, LSD, Ayahuasca, and other trance-inducing substances change your reality.
- 1 Why is that banned?
- 4 Because in a state of altered consciousness, a person behaves inappropriately.
- 3 Most people do not take these substances but behave inappropriately and do terrible things anyway.
- 1 Saddam Hussein and Putin didn't eat mushrooms or drink Ayahuasca.
- 2 Adolph Hitler and Joseph Goebbels didn't take LSD.
- 4 Then why are those substances banned?
- 1 To alter your consciousness is banned.
- 2 Why?
- 3 To stop us from finding out.
- 1 What aren't we supposed to find out?
- 3 The fact that we don't exist.

- 4 Violence, Nationalism, and Drugs only these three things should be banned, and that's it?
- 2 Yes.
- 1 What about sex with a minor?
- 2 It is a form of violence. And it should be banned.
- 1 And if a girl is 17 and she wants it. Is it violence?
- 3 You can't have sex with an underage girl.
- 4 But she wants it.
- 3 Still, she can't decide for herself yet.
- 4 But she is almost 18.
- 3 She can't decide yet.
- 2 When will she be able to?
- 3 When she turns 18.
- 1 Well, what if it's only one month before her 18th birthday?
- 3 You have to wait a month.
- 4 And what if it's 3 days away?
- 3 You have to wait.
- 1 Some countries allow marriages from the age of 13.
- 4 Not in Western culture.
- 2 How does one culture differ from another?
- 3 By their worldviews.
- 4 By their value systems.
- 1 By their evolutionary development.
- 3 By their geographical locations.
- 4 By their political systems.
- 1 By everything.
- 2 How is a woman born in Iran different from a woman born in California?
- 4 Through her karma.
- 3 That's unscientific.
- 1 Defining a person by their nationality or race is unacceptable.
- 2 Yes.

- 4 Defining a person in the traditional religious paradigm is not acceptable any more.
- 3 What exactly is that paradigm?
- 2 What's the definition?
- 4 The vast majority of cultures, peoples, and countries consider normal and healthy people to be heterosexual men and women who believe in God and follow their ancestral traditions.
- 3 And in reality?
- 4 Well, in reality, a person is a Universal Cosmic Consciousness, manifesting itself in billions of different forms and combinations of these forms.
- 3 Science has long said that gender and racial divisions are a product of culture.
- 2 Yes.
- 1 Science does not abolish gender divisions, nationalities, and races.
- 3 But a person is not defined by these concepts.
- 1 Science is only one of three ways of knowing a person.
- 2 What are the other two?
- 1 Intuition and contemplation.
- 4 If I am not a gender, race, or nationality, then who am I?
- 2 I am an action.
- 3 I am a system.
- 1 I am a structure.
- 2 I am an energy.
- 4 I am a pattern.
- 1 I am the cosmos.
- 3 I am life.
- 4 What is life?
- 3 Life means being alive.
- 1 When did life come into being?
- 4 Life doesn't come and go. Life is always there; all there is is life.
- 2 There was no universe before the Big Bang, meaning there was no life.
- 3 That's false thinking.
- 2 Where is the mistake?
- 3 Thinking that the Universe gave rise to life is wrong.
- 1 And in reality?
- 3 And in reality, Life gave rise to the Universe.
- 4 No.
- 2 Yes.
- 3 Life gave rise to the Universe, and life is the source of everything.
- 2 What is life?
- 4 It's the Source of everything.
- 2 It's unscientific.
- 1 It is Knowledge.
- 2 Knowledge of what?
- 4 Knowledge of life.
- 2 What is life?
- 3 Life is something that has always been and forever is. Life is the potential of all living.
- 1 It's unscientific.
- 4 It's Knowledge.
- 2 There was no form, space, substance, or energy before the Big Bang. Meaning there was no life.
- 1 What is life?

- 4 Life is the Potential of all that is and even that which isn't. Life is the potential of even that which may never be.
- 2 And death?
- 4 It's a part of life.
- 1 What's the meaning of life?
- 2 To fulfill your potential.
- 3 To perceive yourself as a part of this life.
- 2 To find harmony.
- 3 To know oneself.
- 4 Evolution.
- 2 Fulfilling your destiny.
- 4 The meaning of life is in the life itself.
- 1 There is no meaning in life.
- 2 In connection with God.
- 3 What is God?
- 2 It's impossible to talk about it.
- 1 Why?
- 4 Because it is a very personal experience and cannot be communicated to others using words.
- 1 So, all religions are meaningless?
- 3 Religion is a primitive and long-outdated form of transmitting the Knowledge of Universal Truth.
- 4 What is Universal Truth?
- 2 It's absolute reality.
- 3 Religion is a primitive and long-outdated form of transmitting Knowledge of Absolute reality.
- 1 Religion is a ritual for transmitting energy.
- 2 Religion is a method of connecting human energy with the energy of the cosmos.
- 4 Religion is a method, not a goal.
- 3 But for most religious people on this planet, religion is a goal.
- 4 Religion is a method.
- 1 Religion is a method for connecting the inside and the outside.
- 3 But for most religious people on this planet, their religion is the only correct method, and when you only have one correct method, this method automatically becomes a goal. Where there is only one opinion, that opinion automatically turns from a method into a goal.
- 4 Hence, religious fanaticism.
- 1 It's the cause of all wars.
- 2 What's the cause of all wars?
- 1 The method is confused with the goal, and they go to war for their method, mistakenly thinking it is the goal.
- 3 What is a goal?
- 4 Life is a goal.
- 2 What is a method?
- 1 A method is a tool to achieve a goal.
- 2 Religion is a method?
- 1 Yes.
- 2 But quite often, religion substitutes a goal.
- 4 Is the truth only in Christianity?
- 2 Yes.
- 3 Is the truth only in Islam?
- 1 Yes.
- 4 Only in Buddhism?

- 3 Yes.
- 1 Religion is a method that substitutes a goal.
- 3 Therefore, religion is an obsolete method.
- 2 And psychedelic mushrooms?
- 1 And LSD?
- 4 And yoga?
- 3 Yoga is translated as a connection.
- 1 The individual energy within a person connects with the outer energy of the Universe, and harmony is achieved.
- 2 That's yoga.
- 4 Yoga is not a religion.
- 1 No, yoga is not a religion.
- 3 Yoga is a connection.
- 4 Then why do we need religion?
- 1 Religion is a method that may suit you personally.
- 4 Not for me.
- 2 Definitely not for me, either.
- 1 Definitely not for me.
- 3 What if it works for me?
- 1 Then, your religion is your method.
- 2 The method of connecting with God?
- 1 Yes.
- 4 What is God?
- 3 God is a dream.
- 2 Hallucination.
- 3 God is All-pervading love and ultimate reality.

- 2 Is it OK to have sexual relationships with another person if you are married?
- 4 It's a private matter for everyone.
- 3 No.
- 1 Yes.
- 2 Society condemns it.
- 1 What society?
- 3 Almost all societies on the planet, with few exceptions, believe that partners cannot have sexual relationships on the side.
- 2 It's pretty much dogma.
- 3 It's the primary condition in a partnership.
- 2 Why?
- 1 Because it's cheating.
- 4 What does "cheating" mean?
- 3 When someone from the couple breaks a cardinal rule.
- 1 What's this rule?
- 3 Neither partner can have sexual relations with other people without prior consent from their partner. As a rule, no one gives such consent.

- 2 Why?
- 3 Because an outdated form of marriage that has been shaped by religions exists.
- 2 Because, at the end of the day, people aren't monogamous?
- 1 What's monogamy?
- 4 It is the rule that a person can only have a sexual and marital relationship with one partner.
- 1 It's unscientific.
- 4 It's scientific.
- 2 It has been assumed that a person is inclined to have only one sexual partner. Although, in fact, this is absolutely not true, according to new scientific research, humans are not monogamous creatures.
- 3 A person can and wants to have many sexual partners at the same point in time.
- 1 How do we know this?
- 3 It's science.
- 1 Science doesn't confirm this.
- 4 It does.
- 1 No.
- 3 Yes.
- 2 No.
- 3 Nowadays, more and more scientists are leaning towards the idea that a human is not a monogamous creature.
- 2 Not everybody from the scientific community would agree with this.
- 4 Numerous studies confirm it.
- 1 But not all of them.
- 3 In the modern, progressive scientific community, it is believed that humans are, in fact, not monogamous.
- 1 Then why doesn't society accept this?
- 3 Because it has been imposed by religions.
- 4 Because the principle of "I and Mine" applies here.
- 1 "I" must have "Mine".
- 2 I want it to be Mine, and Mine should belong to Me.
- 4 "I" appropriates the other "I" to expand.
- 3 "I" wants to expand, and this is why "I" assigns Itself whatever It likes, to make it Mine.
- 1 -"I" wants another "I" to be Mine.
- 4 Everything that I like shall be *mine* and must be *me*.
- 2 Love is an appropriation.
- 3 It is my people, my country.
- 1 My religion, my language, my territory.
- 4 My football team, my flag, my coat of arms, my nationality.
- 2 My husband, my kid, my business.
- 3 The one that I love cannot love anyone else but me.
- 1 The one that I have sex with cannot have sex with anyone else but me.
- 4 The family is a structure that helps humanity develop in the right direction.
- 3 Being faithful to your partner is the preservation of your inner purity.
- 1 What is inner purity?
- 4 I love my wife, and I only have sex with her.
- 2 I love my partner, and I only have sex with him or her. That is purity.
- 1 Why?
- 2 Because it's sacred.
- 4 What is sacredness?

- 3 It's God.
- 1 What is God?
- 2 It's unscientific.
- 3 It's absolute purity.
- 4 What is purity?
- 1 What is filth?
- 2 And what is sickness?
- 4 Sickness is when your body is not working properly.
- 1 Sickness is a deviation from the norm.
- 2 What is the norm?
- 4 When you are healthy.
- 1 What is health?
- 2 When your physical, emotional, and mental states are normal.
- 4 What is a norm?
- 3 It is a harmony and wholeness.
- 1 What is it?
- 2 Two partners are two halves of the same whole.
- 4 Why can't they have sex with somebody else?
- 2 Because they are a single whole.
- 4 And what does sex have to do with it?
- 1 Sex is sacred.
- 3 Sex is sacred?
- 2 Yes.
- 4 No.
- 3 Not always.
- 4 Generally not.
- 1 It's animal instinct.
- 2 It's an intimate communication between the sexes.
- 3 Sex is the expression of love.
- 4 And jealousy?
- 1 It's the opposite of love.
- 3 If you love your husband and he sometimes has sex with another woman, what's wrong with that?
- 2 It's wrong because the purity of marriage is violated.
- 4 What is marriage?
- 3 It's a contract.
- 2 It's a condition.
- 1 It's a rule.
- 4 It's love.
- 2 Marriage is not only about love; it's also about commitment.
- 3 Then, theoretically, you can have sex with others?
- 4 No.
- 1 Yes.
- 2 It must be with prior agreement.
- 3 But in theory, it's ok?
- 4 No, it's not.
- 1 Who decides?
- 2 Both partners.
- 4 Society.

- 1 Laws.
- 4 God.
- 1 What is God?
- 4 God is fear.
- 3 God is freedom.
- 2 It's morality.
- 1 It's slavery.
- 3 It's an illusion.
- 2 It's the Natural order of things.

MALE ANNOUNCER VOICE: The Natural Order of Things is called Rita in Sanskrit. Rita means the Divinely-given and the Only True order of things in Hinduism. The Western notion of Rhythm originates from here. So, does the Arrhythmia. According to Vedic tradition, the one that follows Rita, in other words, the Universal Rhythm, the one who lives accepting reality and integrating into the Natural Order of Things, in Rita, lives a happy, peaceful, and balanced life. Everything is in Order with this person – they are in Rita. And the one who doesn't follow the Natural Order of Things lives in Arrhythmia, and they are not in Order.

Only the recorded voices of actors are heard.

- 4 RECORDED VOICE. Love for one thing or everything at once?
- 3 RECORDED VOICE. Love for everything at once.
- 1 RECORDED VOICE. Love for one person or for everybody?
- 2 RECORDED VOICE. Everybody.
- 4 RECORDED VOICE. If you are talking about love, then you haven't experienced true love yet.
- 3 RECORDED VOICE. What is true love?
- 1 RECORDED VOICE. It's when you don't exist.
- 2 RECORDED VOICE. Yes.
- 4 RECORDED VOICE. No.
- 3 RECORDED VOICE. Love is when "I" don't exist.
- 1 RECORDED VOICE. I can't love because there is no I at all.
- 2 RECORDED VOICE. No one can love because, in love, there is no separate self.
- 4 RECORDED VOICE. Love is when there is no division into You and I.
- 3 RECORDED VOICE. No.
- 1 RECORDED VOICE. Yes.
- 2 RECORDED VOICE. One cannot love another because, in love, there is no division into You and I.
- 4 RECORDED VOICE. No.
- 3 RECORDED VOICE. Yes.
- 1 RECORDED VOICE. Love is when there is no separate "I".
- 2 RECORDED VOICE. "I" cannot love.
- 4 RECORDED VOICE. Why?
- 3 RECORDED VOICE. Because there is no "I".
- 1 RECORDED VOICE. Love is absolute wholeness.

- 2 RECORDED VOICE. There is no I, no You, no He. I do not love you, and you do not love me either. There is only love, without any divisions, choices, or preferences.
- 4 RECORDED VOICE. Love is a state where there is no division into object and subject.
- 3 RECORDED VOICE. Love is when there are no other things but love.
- 1 RECORDED VOICE. Love is when there is only love, and there are no other things but love.
- 4 RECORDED VOICE. Love is all there is.
- 3 RECORDED VOICE. No.
- 1 RECORDED VOICE. Yes.
- 2 RECORDED VOICE. When there is no I, then there is love.
- 4 RECORDED VOICE. It's holiness!

Actors begin to perform live.

- 3 What is holiness?
- 2 Holiness is love.
- 1 No.
- 2 Yes.
- 4 There is no love.
- 1 Yes.
- 3 There is no holiness.
- 4 Yes.
- 2 No.
- 3 As long as I love you, there is no holiness.
- 1 Love is the opposite of holiness.
- 3 Because love is when I want him to belong only to me.
- 4 Love is when I want her to belong only to me.
- 1 Sex is when someone belongs to someone, and that's sex.
- 3 No.
- 2 Yes.
- 3 That's unscientific.
- 4 It's scientific.
- 2 Sex is just a way of communication between living beings. It's just a kind of deep communication.
- 1 And what about sex between a human and an animal?
- 3 But an animal doesn't want it.
- 2 Sex is voluntary. It's only when it's conscious.
- 1 And if an animal wants to have sex with a human, then it's OK?
- 3 An animal is not conscious.
- 4 What is consciousness?
- 2 It's when you know you exist.
- 3 When you feel yourself and everything around you.
- 1 When you are present in the current moment.
- 2 Consciousness is love.
- 1 What is love?
- 4 Love is a state.
- 1 An animal cannot love.
- 2 An animal cannot love?
- 1 Yes.
- 2 No.

- 3 An animal cannot love?
- 4 Love is a state of the Universe.
- 1 Can trees love?
- 2 Yes, trees can love.
- 1 No.
- 2 Yes.
- 1 Love is an illusion.
- 3 Love is a God's principle.
- 4 What is God?
- 3 God is all-pervading Love and Ultimate Reality!

- 2 What's the purpose of your private life?
- 1 There is no private life; there is only the common life of the entire Universe at the same time.
- 3 It's too abstract.
- 4 It's inaccessible.
- 2 It's overly romantic.
- 1 It's the truth.
- 3 No.
- 1 Yes.
- 2 And what's the purpose?
- 4 The purpose is to unite with God.
- 1 What is God?
- 3 God doesn't exist.
- 4 Then what's the purpose?
- 1 In finding harmony.
- 4 What's harmony?
- 1 It's Balance.
- 3 It's Order.
- 2 If I am in a relationship and I have sex with several other people, and I feel in order, is this harmony?
- 3 No.
- 2 Yes.
- 1 It's impossible.
- 4 It's a violation of harmony.
- 3 A falling out of Rita.
- 4 A falling out of Order.
- 2 But I feel in order.
- 3 No.
- 2 Yes.
- 4 Why?
- 3 Because cheating is a falling out of Rita.
- 2 Why?
- 1 Because sex is sacred.

- 2 Why?
- 3 Because my partner's body, apart from himself, belongs only to me.
- 4 Why?
- 3 Because my partner should only be mine.
- 2 And your car?
- 1 It's mine.
- 3 And your house?
- 1 It's mine.
- 4 Why?
- 2 Because I need to have my own space around me. And every bit of this space shall be mine.
- 3 My dress on my body, my lipstick on my lips, my Tesla outside my house, and finally my husband and my children.
- 2 And all of this is yours?
- 3 Yes, it's all mine and it's me.
- 1 And then what's the purpose?
- 3 There is no purpose.
- 4 The purpose is to live in a way so that others feel comfortable living with you.
- 3 There is no purpose.
- 4 There is.
- 3 No.
- 1 I am the purpose.
- 3 My life is the Purpose.
- 2 My partner, my children, my car, my house, and my life are the purpose.
- 4 Can you share all this with others?
- 2 I guess I can share my car and my house, but not my husband and my children.
- 1 And your life?
- 3 Can you share your life with others?
- 2 Give my life for others?
- 1 No need to give, only to share.
- 4 Let the world around you into your life?
- 2 It's very frightening.
- 1 It's very painful.
- 2 And what will happen to my life?
- 3 Absolutely nothing, cause your life doesn't exist.
- 2 My life doesn't exist?
- 1 Yes.
- 4 No.
- 2 What does exist then?
- 3 Life exists, one single life, a common life for the whole Universe.
- 2 Then, who am I?
- 3 You are information.
- 1 You are a vast collection of different information.
- 4 You are genetic information.

- 1 What is genetic information?
- 4 It is all of the information about us that is stored in our DNA.
- 3 It's our destiny.
- 2 It's what our life is made up of.
- 4 There is a scientific view that human life is 80% defined by genes and 20% by the surrounding environment: upbringing, cultural, and social conditions.
- 3 It's more like 60%–40%.
- 2 Scientists always argue about the exact percentage.
- 1 Nowadays, most scientists believe it's 50-50.
- 3 This is political correctness.
- 4 Modern Western science depends on political correctness.
- 2 Scientists fear losing their jobs and falling under the Cancel Culture, so they compromise.
- 3 A person's life is 60% determined by their genes and 40% by their environment.
- 1 50-50.
- 4 80–20.
- 3 60-40.
- 1 So the exact ratio is unknown.
- 2 It is known, but it's hidden.
- 1 It's not hidden.
- 4 It is hidden.
- 3 60-40.
- 1 It's not hidden.
- 4 It is hidden. Everything that is connected with the truth about people is carefully hidden.
- 1 Well, of course not.
- 4 The truth about people is carefully hidden.
- 2 By whom?

- 4 Yes.
- 1 Because some people can control others through manipulation and speculation of the truth.
- 4 Because the majority of people on this planet don't even understand that there's any truth about themselves at all.
- 1 Exactly.
- 2 But why?
- 1 Because they don't even understand that there is any truth at all.
- 2 Why?
- 1 Because they do not possess the Knowledge.
- 3 What is Knowledge?
- 4 Knowledge is knowing of how things actually work.
- 1 Knowledge is knowing the meaning of life.
- 2 Knowledge is knowing the meaning of your life.
- 4 Knowledge is knowing yourself.
- 3 60% of a person is their genes, that is their in-built past, and 40% is the environment in which they develop and the conditions in which they find themselves.
- 2 So what's the Knowledge here?
- 3 The Knowledge is that there is no Free Will. A person is a set of genes and conditions.
- 2 And a choice?
- 1 Who makes this choice?
- 4 A person.

- 3 A person is a set of genes and conditions. Where do you see an opportunity for a free choice here?
- 4 But we choose.
- 3 It's an illusion.
- 1 It's an illusion of choice.
- 3 Our genes and our upbringing choose for us.
- 4 But it seems to me that it's I who chooses.
- 1 It's an illusion.
- 2 What is this "I"?
- 1 It's an illusion.
- 2 Why?
- 3 Because you are just the genes and the environment in which you grew up.
- 2 But I can choose.
- 1 It's an illusion.
- 2 But why?
- 1 Because there is no you.

- 3 Where does conflict originate from?
- 1 When someone crosses my personal boundaries.
- 2 Everything has boundaries.
- 3 Everything has boundaries?
- 4 No.
- 1 Yes.
- 2 Everyone has boundaries that others are not allowed to cross.
- 1 My boundaries are my beliefs, my principles, and my worldview. Crossing these boundaries is a threat to my safety.
- 4 What is safety?
- 2 It's when no one crosses my boundaries.
- 3 What is safety?
- 1 Safety is when my principles, my worldview, my beliefs are not threatened.
- 2 What is a threat?
- 3 A threat is when my boundaries are crossed.
- 1 The boundaries of my religion are crossed, and that's a threat.
- 4 The boundaries of my beliefs are crossed, and that's a threat.
- 2 Why is it a threat?
- 3 Because it threatens me personally.
- 1 When the boundaries of your religion are crossed, are you personally threatened?
- 3 Yes.
- 4 Why?
- 3 Because my religion is me.
- 1 But "Me" doesn't exist.
- 2 The vast majority of people don't know about this.
- 1 What is Knowledge?
- 4 Knowledge is knowing that "the Self" doesn't exist.

- 2 Yes.
- 1 No.
- 3 But my religion exists.
- 2 No.
- 1 It exists.
- 3 My religion protects my soul.
- 2 What is a soul?
- 1 It's a subtle body.
- 4 It is unknown.
- 1 It can't be described with words.
- 3 Because when the boundaries of my worldview are crossed, they threaten me personally.
- 2 Why?
- 3 Because my worldview is me.
- 1 But "Me" doesn't exist.
- 3 For me, my "Self" exists.
- 4 What is your "Self"?
- 3 My "Self" is my worldview, my principles, my beliefs, and my boundaries.
- 4 When my worldview is attacked, it is an attack on me personally.
- 2 Because your worldview is you?
- 4 Yes.
- 1 Because my worldview protects me.
- 3 What is "You"?
- 1 It's a subtle body.
- 3 It's unknown.
- 4 It can't be described with words.
- 3 -How do you know you are threatened?
- 1 Because they cross the boundaries of my worldview.
- 2 Is your worldview you?
- 1 Yes.
- 4 No.
- 3 Yes.
- 2 My principles are me.
- 1 Your principles are you?
- 4 No.
- 2 Yes.
- 4 Your religion is you?
- 2 My religion is me.
- 3 What is "Me"?
- 4 "Me" doesn't exist.
- 1 "Me" does exist.
- 3 No.
- 2 Me is my body, my thoughts, my worldview, my religion, my beliefs, my gender, my territory, my country, my language, my culture.
- 1 Me is my genes.
- 4 Me is my upbringing.
- 2 Me is what I feel I am at the moment.
- 3 So, "Me" is constantly changing?
- 2 Yes.
- 1 No.

- 4 I don't know.
- 3 Do your principles change?
- 1 Yes.
- 2 No.
- 4 Yes.
- 3 Do the boundaries of your "Self" expand?
- 4 No.
- 1 Yes.
- 2 Yes, all the time.
- 4 Yesterday, I was against "something", and today, I'm not.
- 2 Why?
- 4 Because my principles changed.
- 2 Why?
- 4 Because my worldview changed.
- 3 Why?
- 4 Because my boundaries have expanded.
- 1 Yesterday, I was against homosexuality, and today I am not.
- 4 Why?
- 1 Because my boundaries have expanded.
- 3 Yesterday, I thought black people were an inferior race, but today they are not why?
- 1 Because my boundaries have expanded.
- 4 Yesterday, I thought men were superior to women, but today they are not why?
- 3 Because the boundaries of my "Self" expanded.
- 2 My worldview changed, and my boundaries have expanded.
- 4 My boundaries have expanded, and my worldview has changed.
- 1 Why does this happen?
- 3 It's evolution.
- 1 What is evolution?
- 3 It is constant developing.
- 4 It is adaptation to the environment.
- 2 It's survival.
- 3 It's natural selection.
- 4 It's the expansion of your consciousness.
- 2 It's the expansion of the boundaries of your "Self."
- 4 Evolution is the purpose.
- 3 What's the purpose?
- 1 The purpose is to obtain the Knowledge.
- 2 The purpose is to obtain the Knowledge about the meaning of life.
- 1 What's the meaning of life?
- 2 Meaning of life is evolution.
- 1 Evolution is life.
- 4 Life is the meaning.
- 3 What's the purpose?
- 2 The purpose is life.
- 3 It's inexplicable.
- 4 It's God.
- 3 What is God?
- 4 It's inexplicable.
- 1 It's dangerous.

- 2 Pushing your boundaries is dangerous.
- 4 Why?
- 1 Because you can lose the most important thing.
- 4 What is the most important thing?
- 3 God.
- 1 What is God?
- 3 It's the feeling of truth.
- 2 Real life.
- 4 The connection with your heart.
- 2 What is a heart?
- 1 It's an organ.
- 4 It's the center.
- 3 It's God.
- 4 What is God?
- 1 It's life.
- 4 What is life?
- 1 It's when I feel alive.
- 2 Feeling alive is God.
- 1 God is life.
- 2 God means to be alive.
- 4 What if I am an atheist?
- 2 It doesn't matter if you feel alive.
- 1 God is the purpose.
- 3 What's the purpose?
- 1 The purpose is to be alive.
- 3 But God is life itself.
- 4 No.
- 2 Yes.
- 1 Not necessarily.
- 4 I don't know.
- 1 Can you feel alive but be dead at the same time?
- 3 What is death?
- 2 It's the absence of life.
- 1 What is life?
- 2 It's why everything happens and moves along.
- 4 How can this end?
- 2 It can end for me personally.
- 3 What is "Me"?
- 1 Me is my worldview, my principles, my boundaries, my soul.
- 3 What is a soul?
- 2 It's inexplicable.
- 1 If my boundaries are violated, my principles can be destroyed, my worldview can be destroyed, my Self can be destroyed, and that means I have suffered death.
- 4 A tree doesn't have a worldview, but it's alive.
- 3 A tree is not a human being.
- 4 But it's alive.
- 3 It doesn't possess consciousness.
- 2 How do you know that?
- 3 It's science.

- 1 What science?
- 3 Scientific facts.
- 4 A tree has Consciousness.
- 1 Everything has Consciousness.
- 4 Everything that is present here is Consciousness.
- 2 What is consciousness?
- 1 It is what everything is made of.
- 4 It is what drives everything.
- 2 Then, it means that a tree has consciousness because the tree is in motion and it is alive.
- 3 But it can't think.
- 1 And it can't feel pain.
- 3 Is consciousness only thoughts and pain?
- 1 No.
- 4 Yes.
- 3 Consciousness is the self-awareness.
- 2 A tree doesn't know it exists.
- 1 How do you know?
- 2 Because a tree is silent.
- 3 A tree doesn't think about the fact that it exists, but it knows for sure it exists.
- 4 Aren't thinking and knowing the same thing?
- 1 No.
- 2 Yes.
- 1 Thinking doesn't mean knowing.
- 4 What does "knowing" mean?
- 1 To know is to be what you know.
- 3 To know that you are a tree is to be one.
- 1 I am human. I know that I exist.
- 4 You are not a human.
- 1 So what am I?
- 4 If you think you are only human, then you do not know who you are.
- 1 And a tree thinks it is a tree?
- 3 A tree doesn't think.
- 1 A tree is silent.
- 4 Is a tree being silent?
- 2 Is silence a sign of a lack of knowledge?
- 3 Is silence a sign of a lack of consciousness?
- 2 Is silence a lack of life?
- 4 A tree is not silent.
- 3 A tree is life.
- 4 A tree is consciousness.
- 1 What is consciousness?
- 3 Consciousness is life.
- 4 What is life?
- 3 Life is all-pervading Love and Ultimate Reality!

- 4 What's the meaning of your life?
- 1 -It is a trivial question.
- 3 You can't ask others such questions.
- 4 Why not?
- 3 Because it's trivial.
- 2 Because it's intimate.
- 1 Because maybe there is no meaning.
- 2 But what if there is?
- 4 I have one.
- 3 Is it to follow yourself?
- 4 To follow my guiding principle.
- 1 And what is your guiding principle?
- 4 Constant evolution.
- 2 What is evolving?
- 4 My worldview.
- 3 My principles.
- 4 My soul.
- 1 What is a soul?
- 4 It's inexplicable.
- 1 It's unscientific.
- 3 It's a subtle energy field.
- 1 It's unscientific.
- 4 It is what "I" am.
- 1 No.
- 3 Yes.
- 2 The soul does not evolve, it purifies itself.
- 3 The soul connects with the meaning of life.
- 2 What's the meaning of life?
- 3 -It's love.
- 1 What is love?
- 3 Love is the absence of the "Self".
- 2 The "Self" cannot love?
- 3 No.
- 4 Yes.
- 2 How can you give up your "Self"?
- 4 You can't.
- 3 You can.
- 2 No.
- 3 Yes.
- 1 It's the expansion of one's "Self." The expansion of one's boundaries.
- 2 Love is the absence of boundaries?
- 4 No.
- 3 Yes.
- 1 Love accepts everything, gives everything, and demands nothing in return.
- 2 I don't think so.
- 3 Me neither.
- 1 Not me.
- 4 I love my wife and want her to be mine.

- 1 That's not love.
- 4 It's love for my wife.
- 3 No.
- 2 Yes.
- 4 I love my car and want it to be mine.
- 1 That's not love.
- 4 It's love for my car.
- 3 There is nothing "mine" in love.
- 2 And the children?
- 3 They are not yours.
- 2 Whose are they?
- 1 All children on the planet are *our* children.
- 2 No.
- 3 Yes.
- 1 There is no "other" in love. Love is when there is only one.
- 2 Are you the only one?
- 1 Yes.
- 2 Love for oneself?
- 4 No.
- 1 There is no one except me.
- 4 What about me?
- 2 You are me.
- 4 I am *you*?
- 3 Yes.
- 2 This is *no boundaries*.
- 3 Everything around is just me.
- 4 And me?
- 2 You are me.
- 3 "You" and "I" are the same.
- 1 No
- 2 We are one thing expressed in plurality.
- 1 I can't grasp that.
- 3 One energy expressed in millions of other energies.
- 1 It's unclear.
- 4 All people are different but are a manifestation of one.
- 1 One what?
- 2 One consciousness.
- 4 It is unknown.
- 1 It cannot be proven.
- 3 It's beautiful.
- 1 It's unclear.
- 2 You and I are not the same because we have different principles.
- 1 You have your principles, and I have mine; you and I are not the same.
- 4 My principles allow me to draw cartoons depicting Muhammad, and your principles allow you to shoot me for this.
- 1 Because you're overstepping my boundaries.
- 2 It's only just a religion.
- 1 But it's my religion.
- 3 My religion is my boundaries.

- 1 When you draw a caricature of the Prophet Muhammad, you violate my boundaries, and so I grab my assault rifle in order to I kill you.
- 2 But for what?
- 1- For violating my boundaries.
- 4 But your religion violates my boundaries, and I want to poke fun at it.
- 1 How exactly does my religion violate your boundaries?
- 4 You forbid me to make jokes. I love jokes. Humor is my boundaries.
- 3 You can't make jokes about the Prophet Muhammad.
- 4 Who can't?
- 1 No one can.
- 4 But I want to make jokes about everyone.
- 1 But this violates my boundaries, and I take my rifle in order to kill you.
- 4 But I am only joking.
- 1 But it violates my boundaries.
- 4 But you can't ban me from making jokes.
- 1 Yes, I can.
- 4 By banning me from making jokes, you violate my boundaries, and then my jokes become more mean and ruthless.
- 2 Why?
- 4 Because my humor is my boundaries. By forbidding me to make jokes, you violate my boundaries, and then my jokes become even more aggressive.
- 1 And then I grab my rifle in order to kill you.
- 3 I am my religion.
- 2 I am my humor.
- 1 I am my sex, my wife, my gender, my flag, my love.
- 2 Where there is love, there is no gun fire.
- 1 There is gun fire.
- 2 No.
- 1 Yes.
- 3 They shoot their guns out of their love for God.
- 1 Out of their love for the Almighty, they shoot those who insult this love.
- 4 Love cannot be insulted.
- 2 How can Love be offended?
- 4 How can one insult love?
- 1 -You can.
- 3 You can't.
- 1 What is love?
- 2 Love is when I accept you for who you are.
- 1 Are you not overstepping my boundaries?
- 2 No.
- 3 Do you keep your boundaries?
- 1 Yes.
- 2 Do you love my boundaries?
- 4 I accept them.
- 1 You don't cross them?
- 1 No
- 2 What if my boundaries contravene yours?
- 4 In love I am always open.
- 1 No.

- 3 Yes.
- 2- Love is boundless.
- 1 No, it's not.
- 2 "I" am not boundaries, "I" am not principles, and "I" am not a worldview. "I" am love.
- 3 Love is when everything is there, and everything exists in harmony.
- 4 It is acceptance.
- 3 Then, when your partner is having sex with someone else, are you able to accept that?
- 2 No.
- 4 Yes.
- 1 What if someone took your car without your permission?
- 4 It's against the law.
- 2 What is law?
- 1 It's order.
- 2 What is order?
- 3 It's Rita.
- 1 What is Rita?
- 3 It's Cosmic order.
- 1 What is that?
- 4 It's all that this Universe is made up of.
- 1 What is this Universe made up of?
- 2 The Universe is a manifested Consciousness.
- 3 What is Consciousness?
- 4 Consciousness is love.
- 1 What is love?
- 2 It is the complete acceptance of everything the way it is.
- 1 Acceptance of violence?
- 2 Yes.
- 4 No.
- 3 Is love compassionate?
- 4 Compassionate towards what?
- 2 Compassionate towards everything.
- 1 What is compassion?
- 3 Compassion is when I share your sufferings.
- 1 What is suffering?
- 2 It's when I feel pain.
- 3 It's a violation of my boundaries.
- 4 When I am abused, my boundaries are violated and I suffer.
- 3 Suffering is a violation of my boundaries.
- 2 Suffering is a violation of my principles, and my worldview.
- 4 Compassion is when your boundaries are violated, and I suffer with you.
- 1 Why?
- 3 Because I love you.
- 2 Love is when I feel pain because you are in pain.
- 1 Why?
- 2 Because I love you.
- 4 What does it mean to love?
- 3 It means to have none of the boundaries.
- 1 No.
- 2 Yes.

- 4 What is violence?
- 3 Violence is crossing someone else's boundaries without their freely given consent.
- 2 Violence is an invasion.
- 3 Violence closes, but love opens.
- 1 Love is when everything expands.
- 2 Violence is when everything narrows.
- 4 Compressing and decompressing is one process.
- 1 Opening and closing is one process.
- 3 Good and evil is one process.
- 1 No.
- 4 Yes.
- 2 Darkness and light are two sides of the same reality.
- 1 What is reality?
- 3 Reality is Consciousness.
- 1 What is Consciousness?
- 2 Consciousness is all-pervading love and Ultimate reality.

- 3 Do I have the right to kill myself?
- 4 No.
- 2 Yes.
- 1- Why?
- 4 Because you didn't make the decision to be born, you didn't give yourself life, and you can't take it away from yourself.
- 3 So, who made the decision regarding my birth?
- 4 God.
- 3 What is God?
- 1 It is unknown.
- 2 Your parents.
- 3 Then, my parents can take my life away?
- 2 No.
- 1 Why?
- 2 Nature made a decision regarding your birth.
- 1 So nature can take this life from me?
- 4 Yes.
- 2 Yes, but not you yourself.
- 3 I am nature.
- 2 No.
- 1 Yes.
- 3 Who am I?
- 4 Who are you?
- 3 I am nature who makes all the decisions in this Universe.
- 4 All the decisions are made by God.
- 1 What is God?
- 4 God is me.
- 3 Why?

- 4 Because God and I are the same thing.
- 2 No.
- 1 It cannot be proven.
- 3 It's unscientific.
- 4 Nature and I are the same thing. I create myself, and I can take my own life away. It's my choice.
- 2 You do not create yourself.
- 4 I do create.
- 2 No.
- 3 Yes.
- 4 I am creating myself.
- 2 Who are you?
- 4 I am nature.
- 1 You are human; nature created you against your will, and only nature against your will can take your life away.
- 4 Why can't nature take my life away if I want it to?
- 1 Because nature doesn't want it.
- 2 How is that known?
- 3 It is unknown.
- 1 If nature wants you to die, you will die.
- 2 If nature, Your nature wants you to kill yourself, you will do so.
- 1 This is following the laws of nature.
- 3 That is a deviation from the norm.
- 1 Why?
- 2 Because human beings are programmed for survival.
- 3 The whole human organism is programmed to survive, and killing yourself means going against your programming.
- 1 Going where?
- 2 Programmed by whom?
- 3 By nature.
- 4 By God.
- 3 What is God?
- 2 -Is God a program?
- 1 Is human a program?
- 3 Yes.
- 4 No.
- 1 What is this program?
- 3 A program to live.
- 4 To survive and evolve.
- 2 Human is a part of the shared Universe.
- 1 Nature is separated from God.
- 3 How can one thing be separated from another?
- 2 The universe is one single whole.
- 1 It's impossible.
- 3 The jug is inseparable from the clay it's made from.
- 2 The notes are inseparable from the music they form.
- 1 The words are inseparable from their meaning.
- 4 Meaning is inseparable from form.
- 3 Energy is inseparable from its source.
- 2 What is energy?

- 1 It is that which is. It penetrates the entire cosmos.
- 4 Is there only one energy?
- 3 One single energy manifests itself in billions of different energies.
- 2 How is that possible?
- 4 It's impossible.
- 1 It's possible.
- 3 Like a rainbow. The same light is reflected under the sun's rays and creates different colors.
- 2 The Universe is one energy manifesting in various forms.
- 1 No.
- 4 Yes.
- 3 So I am an energy?
- 1 No.
- 2 Yes.
- 4 So, I can give birth to myself and kill myself whenever I want?
- 3 Yes.
- 2 No.
- 3 So, I have complete freedom to do whatever I want.
- 2 Yes.
- 1 God is energy?
- 4 Yes.
- 1 Is energy God?
- 3 No.
- 2 God is energy, but the energy is not God.
- 4 Energy is the manifestation of God.
- 2 God is the source of energy.
- 3 God is the source of life.
- 1 God is life?
- 4 Yes.
- 1 Is life God?
- 3 No.
- 1 What's the meaning of life?
- 3 Life has no meaning, life is an eternal, dynamic process.
- 2 No.
- 4 Yes.
- 1 What's the meaning of life?
- 3 -It's love.
- 2 What is love?
- 4 It cannot be explained.
- 3 God is Love.
- 4 Yes.
- 2 No.
- 3 God is love.
- 4 Love is God.
- 2 No.
- 3 Yes.
- 1 God, Energy, Life, Purpose, Meaning, and the Way are all-pervading LOVE and Ultimate reality.

- 3 What is the main problem?
- 2 Tension.
- 1 Everybody is extremely tense.
- 4 And what do we need to do?
- 1 We need to truly relax.
- 3 What does it mean to relax?
- 2 Relaxing means letting go.
- 4 What does letting go mean?
- 2 Letting go means accepting.
- 1 Letting go means to stop holding back.
- 3 Who is holding back what?
- 2 A person holds back their energy.
- 4 How can a person hold back their energy if the person is the energy?
- 1 So, energy holds itself back.
- 2 Energy holds back energy.
- 3 It's impossible.
- 4 It's inexplicable.
- 2 Energy ties itself into knots and forms a block.
- 4 What is a block?
- 1 It is blocked energy.
- 4 Where is it blocked?
- 1 In the human body.
- 2 In the human mind.
- 3 In their consciousness.
- 4 What is consciousness?
- 3 It's inexplicable.
- 1 Energy traps itself in a person's body, which is why various illnesses, irritation, aggression, and war occur.
- 3 Why is there war going on?
- 2 Because a large amount of energy that has been blocked has escaped.
- 4 Energy can be blocked in the body, in people, in culture, and in the mental code.
- 2 Blocked energy seeks an outlet, and conflict arises.
- 4 War happens when blocked energy bursts out, sweeping away everything in its path.
- 2 Yes.
- 1 No.
- 3 Why is there war going on?
- 2 Because "certain people" are afraid of losing their money and their power.
- 3 Who are these "certain people"?
- 2 "Certain people" are certain principles, a certain worldview, and certain boundaries.
- 4 It's energy.
- 1 Yes.
- 3 That's unscientific.
- 2 What is science?
- 4 It's theory and facts.
- 1 Theories are constantly being disproved.

- 2 As are facts.
- 4 Science is constantly changing, but its primary approach is always the same.
- 2 What is this approach?
- 3 -The desire to analyze and learn.
- 4 Science is a plurality of versions, not a blind belief in the unexplainable.
- 1 So, there are many versions of everything that happens?
- 4 A multitude of versions.
- 3 Name one other version which explains the outbreak of war?
- 2 It's fear.
- 4 It's ethnocentrism.
- 3 What is ethnocentrism?
- 1 It is when a person identifies with their nationality, their religion, their culture, their country, their football team.
- 2 "I" am my language, my territory, my culture, my flag, my coat of arms, my wife, my football team.
- 4 "I" am my war.
- 3 "I" am my boundaries.
- 1 These are defined boundaries.
- 2 Boundaries of what?
- 3 Boundaries are what many people consider themselves to be.
- 1 It's their principles, their worldview, their boundaries.
- 4 It's energy.
- 1 No.
- 4 Yes.
- 2 Why is there a conflict?
- 4 Because some people expand their boundaries at the expense of others.
- 1 Your boundaries expand, and they start to violate my boundaries.
- 3 My boundaries are violated because yours are expanding, and that's the conflict.
- 1 The boundaries of "One life values" expand, and they start to violate the boundaries of the "Other life values."
- 2 What are those "Life values"?
- 4 It's a certain worldview, certain principles, and certain boundaries.
- 1 It's energy.
- 3 No.
- 1 Yes.
- 2 Why are the boundaries of "Life values" expanding?
- 1 Because more and more people share these principles, this worldview, this is why the boundaries are expanding.
- 2 What should those who do not share these principles do?
- 4 Resist.
- 1 Relax.
- 3 It's unknown.
- 4 Kill themselves.
- 2 Drop an atomic bomb and end it all.

- 3 I am the infinity, and I have no boundaries. I don't threaten anyone, my boundaries do not expand, and I attack no one.
- 1 What is "infinity?"
- 3 It's when nothing ever ends.
- 4 If there is no end, then there is no infinity. Because infinity only exists when there is at least a hypothetical possibility of an end.
- 3 Infinity is the denial of an end.
- 2 But the end doesn't exist.
- 4 Therefore, neither does infinity.
- 1 Yes.
- 3 No.
- 4 There is no beginning, no end and no infinity.
- 3 But I exist.
- 1 No.
- 3 I exist.
- 2 If there is a Self, then there are boundaries to that Self.
- 3 There is a Self without any boundaries.
- 4 Then, this Self doesn't exist.
- 1 It exists but has no boundaries.
- 2 If there is a Self, there are boundaries to that self.
- 3 So what do I do then?
- 4 Resist.
- 1 Kill yourself.
- 4 Relax.
- 3 What does it mean "to relax"?
- 4 -To relax means to let go.
- 3 What does "letting go" mean?
- 2 Letting go means accepting.
- 3 What does it mean to accept?
- 1 To accept means to trust completely.

- 2 God.
- 1 The cosmos.
- 2 Energy.
- 3 Consciousness.
- 2 The only Divine Cosmic Order Rita.
- 1 To believe is to let go.
- 3 To let go is to stop holding on.
- 4 To let go is to stop holding on to something.
- 1 What do I need to let go of?
- 4 You need to let go of your principles, your worldview, and your boundaries.
- 1 It's unscientific.
- 3 And what will be left then?
- 2 Nothing.
- 1 Nothing will be left at all.
- 2 No boundaries, no worldview, no infinity.
- 3 It's very dangerous.
- 4 What is danger?
- 3 Danger is when something threatens my life.

- 4 What is life?
- 3 It is the fear of losing life.
- 2 I am afraid, so I cannot let go.
- 1 I can't relax.
- 2 I will defend my boundaries, my principles, my "Eastern" or my "Western" world.
- 1 So what am I to do?
- 3 Pray.
- 2 Surrender.
- 4 Love.

- 1 Why do we need to ban things?
- 2 To respect one's own boundaries as well as those of others.
- 1 What does "others" mean?
- 3 "Others" means that it's not you.
- 1 What does "You" mean?
- 4 You are something different than "I".
- 2 What does "I" mean?
- 3 "I" am something completely different from you.
- 2 Why is it banned?
- 4 Almost everything is banned.
- 1 Love is allowed.
- 3 Not free love.
- 1 What does "free love" mean?
- 4 Love that is not restricted by any rules.
- 3 So, there is no such love because everything is limited by something.
- 2 Freedom is not limited by anything.
- 3 What is "freedom?"
- 4 Freedom is the absence of boundaries.
- 1 Everything has boundaries.
- 4 Freedom is being free from your own boundaries.
- 1 How can one be free from one's boundaries?
- 3 When there is no center, it's freedom.
- 2 Freedom is when there is no center.
- 4 Freedom is when there is no Self.
- 1 It's unscientific.
- 4 It's possible.
- 1 How can one be free from their boundaries, if your boundaries are you?
- 2 Freedom from yourself.
- 1 How can one be free from themselves?
- 3 My boundaries are not me, and "I" am not my boundaries.
- 1 What are you then?
- 3 I just am. And I don't have any boundaries.
- 4 -"I" is when everything is possible.
- 2 Everything?
- 4 "I" is when absolutely everything is possible.

- 1 Absolutely everything?
- 4 Yes, absolutely everything.
- 1 Even violation of your boundaries?
- 4 I have no boundaries.
- 2 Even going against your principles?
- 4 I have no principles.
- 3 So, you yourself just don't exist.
- 4 Yes, I myself just don't exist.
- 1 No.
- 4 Yes.
- 2 No.
- 1 I have principles, and these principles are my worldview and my boundary.
- 2 And violating this boundary is absolutely forbidden.
- 3 I forbid you to cross my boundaries.
- 1 You forbid me to violate your principles.
- 4 Love has no principles nor boundaries.
- 3 What is "love?"
- 1 It's something that doesn't have principles nor boundaries.
- 3 Everything has boundaries if it exists.
- 4 God has no boundaries.
- 1 Therefore, there is no God.
- 2 Everything has boundaries, and these boundaries are essential.
- 4 What are boundaries?
- 1 Boundaries are directions of energy flow in a certain direction. Banks are the boundaries of rivers. Houses are boundaries that keep the energy protected from the prying eyes.
- 2 Boundaries are our choices.
- 3 Boundaries are cosmic energy manifesting itself in the form of my Self.
- 1 Boundaries are my body, my thoughts, my scent, and my individual destiny.
- 2 Everything has boundaries, and they are very important.
- 4 Boundaries create objects of art for us to enjoy.
- 3 What is art?
- 1 Art is an artificially created thing, object, thought, idea, or music limited by clear boundaries, so that the viewer can easily distinguish that thing from the rest of reality.
- 2 Boundaries are a frame.
- 3 In museums, paintings have a frame to separate the artificially created painting from the wall.
- 4 In art, the frame is very important because it is thanks to the frame that we see the art itself.
- 1 A frame is a boundary.
- 2 Everything has boundaries, and these boundaries are very important.
- 3 God has no boundaries.
- 4 God has no frame.
- 1 -And what about an icon?
- 2 And religion?
- 3 Religion is the frame of God.
- 1 An icon is God gaining boundaries.
- 2 We create boundaries for God by making Him Limited, because we can perceive things limited by the frame.
- 1 My wife is limited to the frame of our marriage.
- 4 My kids are limited to the frame of our family tradition.
- 1 My worldview is limited to the frames of national culture.

- 2 My Self is limited to the frame of my destiny.
- 3 What is destiny?
- 4 Destiny is your life planned out for you in advance.
- 1 Who has planned it?
- 2 God.
- 3 Karma.
- 4 The Universe.
- 1 Destiny is the frame of your life.
- 2 So, my life is a work of art?
- 3 Yes.
- 4 No.
- 1 So, my life is an object?
- 3 Yes.
- 4 No.
- 2 If my life has a frame, then who is observing it as an object of art? Who is this frame for?
- 4 In museums, paintings are framed to separate the painting from the wall.
- 3 The frame is for those who watch.
- 2 The frame is for the beholder.
- 1 The frame is for the observer.
- 4 The frame is for those who wish to enjoy the object.
- 3 Yes.
- 2 But who is observing my life?
- 1 God.
- 4 God doesn't exist.
- 3 Aliens.
- 2 They don't exist.
- 1 You.
- 2 I observe my life as a painting on the wall, and in this case, the frame is very important.
- 3 Boundaries are very important so that the Universe can observe Itself.
- 1 The Universe creates things and puts them in frames in order to observe Itself.
- 4 I create my Self and put it in a frame of my body, my worldview, my nationality, my language, and my culture so that I can observe myself.
- 2 I need myself to observe my Self.
- 3 You need me to observe my Self.
- 1 I need you to observe my Self.
- 4 We need each other to observe my Self.
- 2 You are Me, placed in the frame of your life, to observe my Self.
- 1 What does "to observe" mean?
- 4 To observe means to become aware.
- 3 I am You, put in a frame of my life, to become aware of My Self.
- 1 What is Awareness?
- 2 Awareness is all-pervading love and Ultimate reality!
